## Dear Editor:

I was dismayed by the Inquirer's recent editorial endorsing candidate Shelley Adler over current NJ-3 Congressman Jon Runyan. I wanted to share my views about what a great job Congressman Runyan has done for South Jersey, and what a tremendous advocate he has been for his constituents.

Since Jon was elected to Congress, he took with him the attitude that he was there to represent everyone.
