## 825Briefs

#### On the job: Spectra pipeline project breaks ground

After months of meetings, reviews, challenges, and finally, approval, the Spectra Energy pipeline expansion project is on the way to becoming reality.

Local 825 operating engineers joined a small army of tradesmen to begin the project, to deliver energy supplies to help fuel the local economy.

The project will also bring essential new construction jobs to our region and our members will share the benefits.



#### **15-acre site on the Passaic River**

Groundbreaking took place in Newark on a 15-acre site on the Passaic River that will be redeveloped into a warehouse and distribution center. The site, at 60 Lister St., was formerly home to the Sherwin Williams paint company.

The Morris Companies, longtime re-developers of Brownfield sites, will build the 350,000-square-foot center, targeting one or two businesses. The project is expected to bring more than 400 construction jobs in addition to 200 permanent positions, according to Newark officials.

## NJ extends project deadlines at public colleges & universities

Legislation sponsored by Senator Raymond Lesniak and Senate President Steve Sweeny became law in May to extend the deadline for the state's public colleges and universities to enter into public-private partnerships for new, on-campus capital construction projects.

The new law extends until August 1, 2013, the deadline for institutions to apply to the state's Economic Development Authority (EDA) for a public-private partnership on projects to build, renovate or expand on-campus buildings and facilities. The prior deadline was this past February 1.

#### Among the projects that will be impacted by the new deadline:

- Montclair State University: Cogeneration heating, cooling and electricity plant, plus distribution system;
- The College of New Jersey: Campus Town project;
- New Jersey City University: 300-400 bed residence project;
- Ramapo College: Final paperwork on 5 megawatt solar installation, new roofs and cogeneration heating, cooling and electricity facility;
- William Paterson University: 100-300 bed residence project

### Development projects also get a reprieve

The Assembly approved legislation sponsored by Majority Leader Lou Greenwald to promote job creation and economic development by extending the life of development projects that had been stalled by the economic downturn. The bill would extend permit approvals for development projects until December 31, 2014. Under current law, the approvals expire on December 31, 2012.

### **TTF Renewal**

Gov. Chris Christie signed into law legislation to create a \$3.2 billion fund for capital transportation projects that are funded equally by the State and federal government. The legislation was sponsored by Deputy Assembly Republican Leader John Amodeo, R-Atlantic (and also a retired member of Local 825), and Assembly Republican Whip Scott Rumana, R-Passaic, Bergan, Essex and Morris.

The bill requires that all debt service be paid with already constitutionally dedicated funds (Motor Fuels Tax, Petroleum Products Gross Receipts Tax and Sales Tax). Funds received from toll road authorities or other State agencies cannot be used to pledge for the payment of transportation bonds.

# 2013 selection process for new apprentices begins this September for two weeks

Seventy-five (75) applications are being made available for the Operating Engineers Local 825 Apprenticeship Program class that will begin next spring. Applications must be completed in person at the Local 825 Training Center, 338 Deans Rhode Hall Road, South Brunswick, N.J., on any of the following times:

• Saturday, Sept. 8, from 8 a.m. - 12 noon.

• Monday, Sept. 10 through Friday, Sept. 14, from 8-11 a.m. and from 1-3 p.m.

• Monday, Sept. 17, from 8-11 a.m. and from 1-3 p.m.

#### Applicants must:

- 1. Be at least 18 years of age
- 2. Have a valid driver's license

3. Have a high school diploma or GED; and must provide transcripts (high school and any post-high school education and training, if applicable)

Military veterans must provide a copy of their DD-214.
